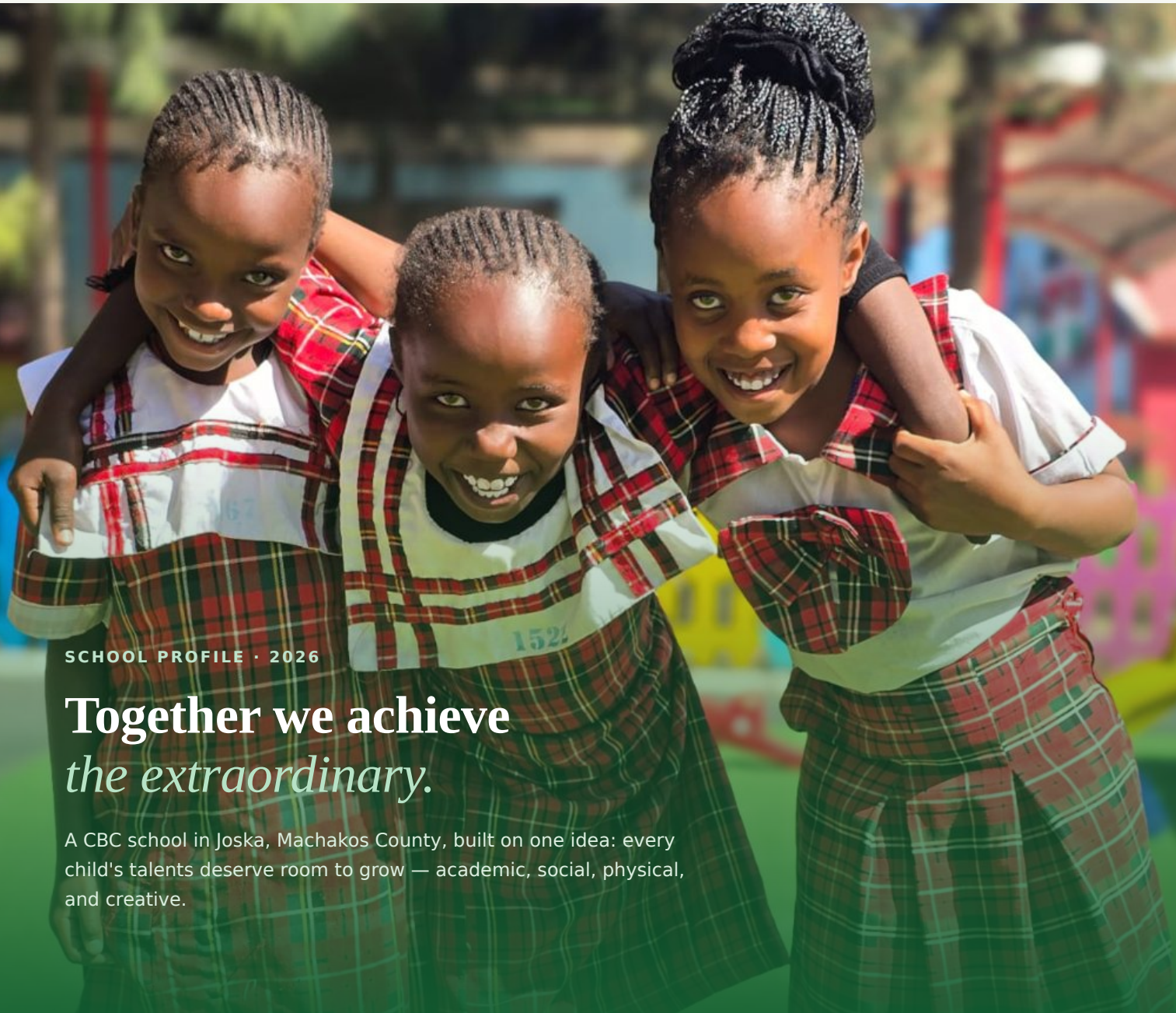

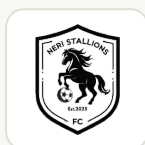
School uniform

- 1 Fees are payable in full on or before the first day of every term.
- 2 Advance fee payment (full fees paid before the term opens) attracts a 5% discount on tuition fee.

- 4 The caution fee is refundable, less deductions for lost or damaged school property.
- 5 Withdrawing a child requires one term's written notice, acknowledged in writing by the headteacher — otherwise a full term's fee is payable in lieu of notice.
- 6 Weekly boarding is available on request; the school treats the boarding fee as one unit.
- 7 All signed-up activities are billed and treated separately from tuition and other fees.
- 8 Fees are payable through the designated bank accounts or the M-Pesa paybill wallet.
